

"London Doorways: An expanded study of triplearch doorways".... It aims to celebrate this



# beautiful and uniquely London doorway!

So many people were intrigued by our own triple-arch 'London' doorways, that we decided to expand on our first short publication (2014) about them. This was inspired by the research undertaken by

long-time architectural historian and ACO London member Julia Beck.

We wanted to learn more about these unique Victorian architectural features....are they truly unique to London?.....what are their architectural design underpinnings?....how were they made and who crafted them?....where are they found?....and on what style of house?....and who were the people who chose them for their front doorways?

We discovered that there are at least 73 still extant in the city and close environs and most have been carefully conserved by their owners.

The book is generously illustrated with professional photographs. Our own ACO team of Kyle Gonyou, Dorothy Palmer, Nancy Tausky, Genet Hodder, Mike Bloxam and Maggie Whalley conducted the new research and wrote the illuminating commentary. Historical House Sign Program A dedicated team of volunteers continue to work on this project. Each property takes between 10 and 20 hours to research. The package includes a sign featuring the name of the original owner and their occupation as well as the year of construction, and a print monograph including history on the home and its owners that is uncovered by our volunteer research team. Due to the popularity of this project, orders are taking longer to process. It's a great glimpse into your neighbourhood's history!



To date we have delivered 637 HHS packages, with many more in-progress. We reinstated ordering last September on a limited basis which is

released quarterly following the engthy "PAUSE" which took place during the later pandemic years.

Popularity for this service continues to be very high, with orders selling out in a matter of minutes each quarter. We are considering if there is another option for sales which is less frustrating for our interested customers; where there appears to be a panic to secure an order before they sell out. Our volunteer research committee is also strong with many volunteers assigned to research our property orders. ACO London participated at the **LHBA Lifestyle Home Show** again this past January. This was our 4th year setting up our community outreach display at this huge event at the Western Fair Agriplex.

This event is a great opportunity for the London Region branch of Architectural Conservancy Ontario to engage and interact with a broad audience of home owners and property managers. Our display includes features of our branch's annual and ongoing initiatives in the community which highlights our signature annual events

ACO London frequently receives requests from the public for skilled professionals to repair or restore older homes, and no more so than at this home renovation-focused trade show. This event is a great opportunity to help make heritage homeowners aware that the same types of skilled craftspeople who built their cherished homes are still out there, and that they don't have to resort to lesser quality skills and materials when it comes to maintaining the signature character of their homes.

There are **over 5000 buildings with heritage designation in London**, including **seven heritage conservation districts** that are primarily residential. Add to that thousands of other houses not currently designated, and you realize that London has a huge inventory of older homes and owners who want to maintain their original character with the expertise of trained professionals! ACO London has maintained a healthy partnership with the LHBA Lifestyle Home Show team, and we will continue to request participation in the coming years.
